- 2. The data (RSL): word order
 - the basic word order SVO
 - negative manual signs:

Regular (after the verb)	Irregular ¹	
NOT ²	WANT.NOT, BE.NOT, NEED.NOT	

- Regular negation may change the basic word order (1) to SOVNeg
- (1) a. MOTHER BUY BOOK

'Mother bought a book'

b. MOTHER BOOK BUY NOT

- c. *Mother buy not $BOOK^3$
- 'Mother did not buy a book'
- Irregular negation also can use as sentential (predicate negation?)
- ¹ Do they exist in DGS?

- How do we know that Subject vacates vP before the headshake (hs) spreads its properties?
- And does Subject move to TP / CP? And where is TP?
- How to analyze pronoun subject?
- Is it right, that when the hs spreads over the predicate, the verb moves to Neg°, when the hs spreads over Object too, there is spreading properties of the hs?

- (2) MOTHER BOOK BUY/BUY BOOK BE.NOT 'Mother did not buy a book'
- (3) ENGLAND NEVER.ONCE 'I have never been to England'

The headshake spread over:

- Irregular manual negation
- (4) <u>hs</u> INDEX-1 KNOW.NOT

'I do not know'

Regular negation over: NOT (5a), the verb + NOT(5b), Object + the verb + NOT (5c), the whole utterance (6,7)

• May be different scope of face expressions and head movements

- 4. The data (RSL): the interaction of the manual negator with n-words
 - difference between adjunct and argument
- (9) INDEX TIDY BOY NEVER LATE NOT
 - 'This tidy boy is never late'
- (10) WRITER WRITE NOTHING
 - 'The writer did not write anything'
 - argument of regular and irregular verb
- (11) BOY K-O-L-Y-A NOBODY KNOW.NOT 'Kolya nobody knows'
- (12) NOBODY HELP 'Nobody helps'
- (13) NOBODY LET.NOT 'No one is allowed to enter'
- (14) INDEX-1 MEET NOBODY MEET NOT 'Nobody did not meet me'
- (15) NOBODY ANSWER NOT PHONE 'Nobody answers the phone'
